Measure A Essential Health Care Services Tax

n March 4, 2004, 71% of Alameda County voters passed Measure A, which imposed a half-cent sales tax to support emergency medical, hospital inpatient, outpatient, public health, mental health, and substance abuse services to indigent, low-income, and uninsured adults, children, families, seniors and other county residents.

Services Provided by Measure A

- Behavioral health, acute, ambulatory, emergency, urgent and trauma services at Highland Hospital and other public hospitals and wellness centers
- Preventive health services to indigent, low-income, and uninsured children, families, and seniors
- Deputy Sheriffs' Activities League Dig Deep Farms Program grows, distributes, and sells healthy, affordable fruits and vegetables to low-income families
- Nutrition program, exercise, dancing, yoga, and other healthy activities to Korean seniors
- Preventative, educational, and therapeutic services to reduce alcohol and drug abuse
- Health promotion programs in the Ashland and Cherryland communities
- Oral health assessment and preventive dental services for high-risk families and children

Impact on Alameda County

- 39,775 uninsured residents received medical services at Alameda Health System through 297,889 outpatient visits, 82,060 visits to the Highland campus emergency room and trauma department, and 11,420 visits to John George Psychiatric Emergency Services.
- 5,000 warm, nutritious meals and daily safety "check-ins" were provided to seniors living in the unincorporated Castro Valley area by Senior Opportunities for Seniors, Inc.
- 451 day labor workers received health-related referral services in a year.
- More than 300 families received more than 50 tons of food from Dig Deep Farms in a year.
- 90% of children under age 5 years in the Healthy Kids Healthy Teeth Program received dental care within the first year.
