## ALAMEDA LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2004-35

## APPROVING THE UPDATE OF THE SPHERE OF INFLUENCE FOR THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES COUNTY SERVICES AREA (CSA)

- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 56425 et seq. requires the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) to develop and determine the sphere of influence of each local governmental agency within the County; and
- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 56425(f) requires that LAFCo review and update the adopted sphere of influence boundaries, as necessary, not less than once every five years; and
- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 56430 requires that a municipal services review be conducted prior to or in conjunction with a sphere of influence update; and
- WHEREAS, LAFCo conducted a municipal services review of the services provided by the Emergency Medical Services CSA and adopted written determinations as required by Government Code Section 56430 on September 16, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Emergency Medical Services CSA's sphere of influence is currently coterminous with its service boundaries; and
- WHEREAS, no change in regulation, land use or development will occur as a result of updating the District's sphere of influence; and
- WHEREAS, in the form and manner prescribed by law, the Executive Officer has given notice of a public hearing by this Commission regarding the location of this sphere of influence map;
- WHEREAS, the sphere of influence update was duly considered at a public hearing held on November 4, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Alameda LAFCo heard and received all oral and written protests, objections and evidence that were made, presented or filed, and all persons present were given an opportunity to appear and be heard with respect to any matter pertaining to said verification action.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Alameda LAFCo hereby:

- 1. Approve and affirm the existing the sphere of influence for the Emergency Medical Services CSA as generally depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 2. Consider the criteria set forth in Government Code Section 56425(e) and determine as follows:
  - a. The present and planned land uses in the area, including agricultural and open-space lands—
    The area includes a range of land uses including open space land. The CSA's SOI is countywide, and does not conflict with existing or planned land uses. The areas included with this sphere of influence update do not affect agricultural lands. The CSA has no land authority, and no change to the present or planned uses will result from this sphere of influence update.

- b. The present and probable need for public facilities and services in the area Services are currently being provided and need to be continued. No changes in public facilities or services provided by the CSA will result from this sphere of influence update.
- c. The present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the agency provides or is authorized to provide The sphere of influence update will not affect the present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services or the services provided by the CSA.
- d. The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if the commission determines that they are relevant to the agency The sphere of influence update will not affect the existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area that are relevant to the CSA.
- e. The existence of agricultural preserves or other important agricultural or open space land in the area which could be considered within an agency's SOI, and the effect on maintaining the physical and economic integrity of such resources in the event that such resources are within a SOI of a local governmental agency Emergency medical services are needed in all areas, and do not, by themselves, induce or encourage growth on agricultural or open space lands. The SOI update will not adversely affect agricultural or open space land or be growth inducing. No Williamson Act contracts will be affected.
- f. Nature, location, extent, functions & classes of services to be provided The EMSCSA provides direct emergency medical services, including monitoring and approving paramedic (EMT-I) training, certifying and accrediting paramedics, authorizing advanced life support programs, establishing policy for medical control of EMS systems, including dispatch and various aspects of patient care, regulation of ambulance services, and monitoring contacts with fire departments, ambulance transport agencies, trauma centers and base hospitals throughout the County. The EMSCSA contracts with fire departments to provide countywide first responder paramedic services.
- 3. Determine, as lead agency for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), that the sphere of influence update is categorically exempt under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.
- 4. Direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption as lead agency under Section 15062 of the CEQA Guidelines.
